

However, owing to the fact that the economy is weak and lack of social corporate will from entities to partner and support teams and make sport a lucrative venture, hence narrowing the possibility of the athletes' chance to make it. Financial Management Capacity

The following accounting measures are put in place to ensure that the huge sum of finances are properly utilized and kept. The organization serve its bank account with Access bank Kalingalinga Branch.

- ☐ The organization maintains a bank account and the board members have the responsibility to allocate funds on the basis of the work plan. Board members prepare guidelines for management of funds and financial reports accompanied by narrative progress reports are submitted to co-operating partners. ☐ The organization has separates project funds system and adequate controls exits to avoid funding across projects such as cash and cheque and vouchers describing the intended use for the cash to be withdrawn etc. ☐ Financial reporting and audit data systems are available to provide useful and timely financial information. ☐ Reports are timely and accurate and provide information use to the financial planning progress.
